History

- ❑ Started in World War II as a mix of heavy industry and manufacturing. In 1980 the area had fallen into a deep decline because of international competition.
- ❑ The Government introduced a radical "cluster" policy with the aim of boosting the regional economy.
- ❑ As a result, it created around 50,000 new jobs and put Styria firmly into the top 50 of Europe's most innovative regions.
- ❑ Styria now specializes in high-grade automotive steel and is a leader in the manufacture of paper mill machinery. Local employment is up from 495,000 in 1995 to 539,800 in 2005.
- ❑ Styria is Austria's fourth largest province with an industrial base focused on traditional heavy engineering.
- ❑ Unemployment has fallen by 50,000 and the area is now rated as Europe's 41st most innovative region.
